

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- Proposals should address
 - Review existing planning documents
 - Evaluation of existing conditions on the Rock Island Trail and Downtown Greenwood
 - Robust public and stakeholder engagement process
 - Recommendations that are coordinated with stormwater study to maximize improvements
- DBE Goal: 22%
- Final Report Due: December 15, 2023


- Tasks
 - Complete an existing plan review to establish context for trail connection and downtown improvements
 - Determine a public engagement strategy that includes stakeholders and the general public
 - Make recommendations for Rock Island Trail alignment in Greenwood
 - Make recommendations for infrastructure improvements in Downtown Greenwood that increase walkability and economic vitality

DOWNTOWN CORRIDOR IMPROVEMENT PLAN

CITY OF BASEHOR, KS





- Proposals should address
 - Developing the highest value upgrades in terms of the greatest benefit to the overall desire to improve the walkability of the area with respect to limited funds for improvements.
 - This plan will seed to include the residents currently living in the subject area and will give high priority to the desires of the residents living in the subject areas.
 - The plan will provide options for immediate solutions as well as longer-term goals.
- DBE Goal: 10%
- Final Report Due: June 30, 2024

- Tasks
 - Existing conditions inventory
 - Conduct robust public engagement, target neighborhood members
 - Identify and prioritize safety improvements
 - Identify improvements for pedestrian, bicycle and parking access
 - Honor veterans in the corridor
 - Identify gaps and establish priorities for sidewalk and multiuse path
 - Identify potential MetroGreen connections
 - Inventory existing tree canopy and identify landscaping opportunities
 - Inventory existing lighting and identify potential improvements
 - Engage electric utility to determine feasibility of burying services
 - Project Budget: \$30,000

 - Project understanding (20%)
