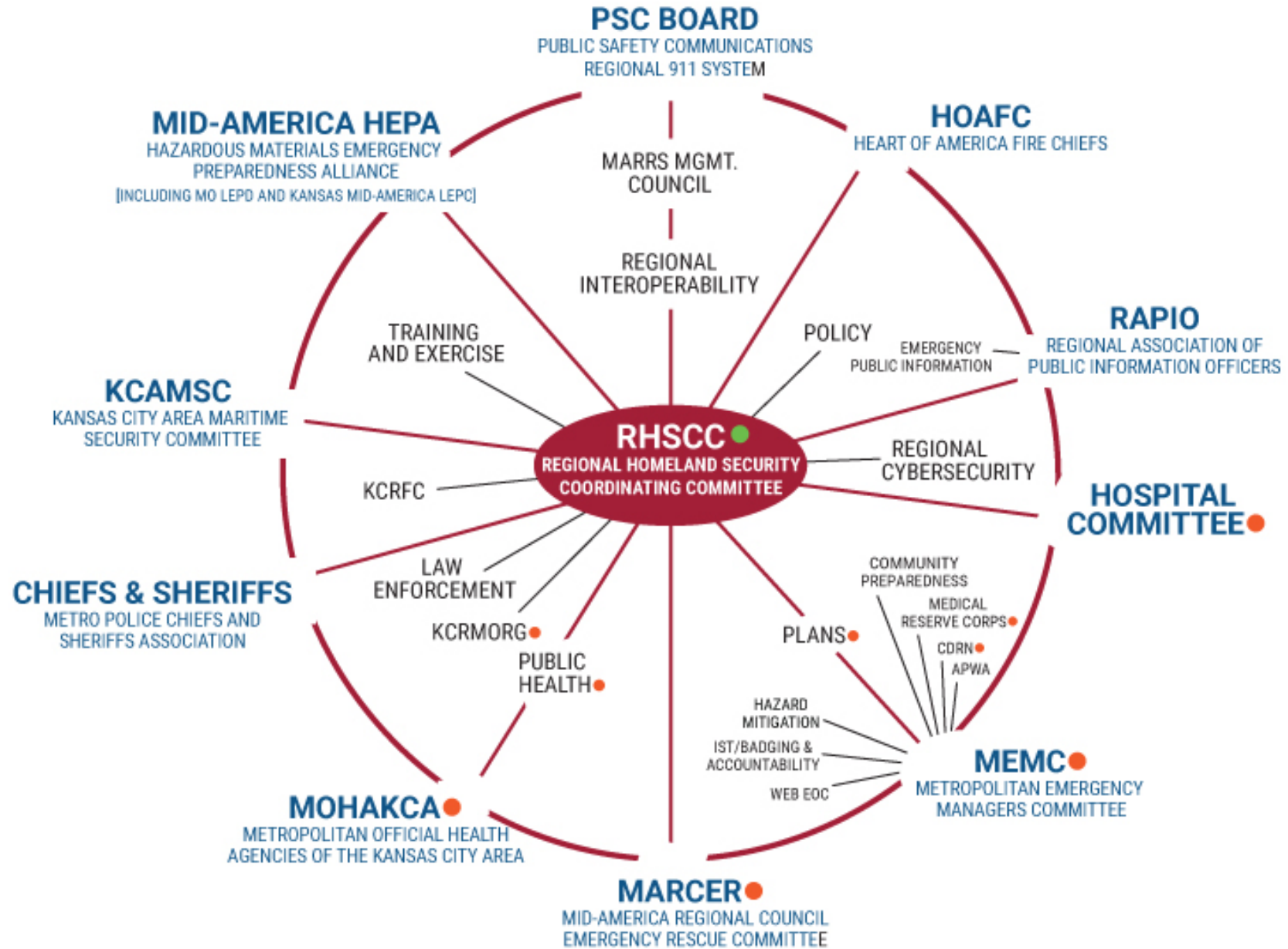

Evaluate and Continuously Improve Capabilities

Plan for all hazards. Synchronize and exercise regional and local plans and protocols for the coordination of efforts to Prevent, Protect, Mitigate, Respond to, and Recover from regional risks, threats and hazards.

Objectives:

- **Manage** plans
- **Support** jurisdictions and agencies
- **Evaluate** and continually improve capabilities

Progress Metrics:

- Review and update plans once per year.
Brief RHSCC on substantive changes.
 - All committees
- Conduct AAR of real-world events annually (can be in region or beyond)
 - All committees
- Develop and Share regional Exercise After Action Reports and improvement plans
 - Training and Exercise Sub-Committee



Secure and Administer Financial Resources

Oversee funding through the RHSCC. Ensure the ability to bring additional financial resources to the region to support cooperative emergency services work.

Objectives:

- Oversee budget
- Manage financial resources
- Identify and secure additional funds
- Ensure transparency

Progress Metrics:

- Agencies/organizations contributing to Emergency Services (ES) Local Funding Strategy: $\geq 90\%$ of agencies contribute
- On-time grant application submission as dictated by Notice of Funding Opportunity or solicitation:
 - KS Hazardous Materials Emergency Preparedness – Feb
 - MO Chemical Emergency Preparedness – Hazardous Materials – Aug
 - MO Bioterrorism Hospital Preparedness ASPR – Jan/Feb

Gather and Share Information

Ensure processes are in place for information sharing. Drive awareness, deliver training, and encourage engagement by stakeholders. Curate and disseminate timely and accurate information.

Objectives:

- Communicate effectively...
 - to all impacted communities before, during and following incidents.
 - through the Regional Fusion Center
- Provide training
- Mobilize information resources and pipelines.

Progress Metrics:

- Increase participation in provided trainings
- Expand participation in Fusion Center in all disciplines by 2025:
 - 2023: [Baseline year] 2024: [#] 2025: [#+]
- Each “regional” communications system is incorporated in an exercise at least annually:
 - practicing the creation of a regional common operating picture and through exercise or real-world event
 - Operational coordination structures are exercised/evaluated every other year through exercise or real-world event
 - Review Regional Resource Annex annually

The **Regional Homeland Security Coordinating Committee (RHSCC)** provides leadership to the region's efforts to enhance capabilities to prevent, protect, respond to and recover from a broad range of threats and hazards, including terrorism, by strengthening relationships between jurisdictions and across disciplines; outlining protocols for regional action; maximizing the sharing and coordination of resources; and enhancing the capabilities of first responders/receivers through equipment, training and exercise investments; and improving surveillance, early detection and mitigation of hazards and threats.

REGIONAL COORDINATION GUIDE: BASE GUIDE

PURPOSE

The purpose of the RCG Base Guide is to identify and describe the following:

- Local units of government and jurisdictional boundaries in the region
- Existing emergency plans, procedures, and preparedness activities in the region
- Regional stakeholders and available regional assets
- Coordination of activities during events with regional significance, specifically:
 - How regional coordination will be initiated
 - How relevant information will be enhanced
 - How available resources will be identified and shared
 - How common messages will be developed and disseminated
- Roles and responsibilities of involved jurisdictions, agencies, and organizations
- Testing and maintenance of the protocols described in the RCG

DESCRIPTION

The Kansas City Metropolitan Area Regional Coordination Guide (RCG) is intended to ensure coordination among jurisdictions in the metro area during emergency events whose impacts or potential impacts cross jurisdictional boundaries. The Base Guide integrates what was formally known as **ESF 5 and 7**.
