
Funding sources

AAA eligible participants aren't obligated to pay for OAA-funded services but can donate if they wish.



Forward looking and informed by lived experience, the area plan is designed to address the evolving needs of older adults and caregivers.





Seven broad goals




Missouri State Plan on Aging 2024-2027

PSA = Planning and Service Area MARC AAA is Region 7







Older Americans Act (OAA) Reauthorization

Understanding the OAA

Established in 1965 to support older adults in remaining independent.

Funds a range of services including nutrition programs, caregiver support, and elder rights protection.

Significantly more administrative complexities written into the reauthorization (pending U.S. House approval).

Federal funding administered through the Missouri Department of Health and Human Services, State Unit on Aging.

• Current challenge: State appropriation (spending) authority for existing federal fund.




Conclusion
